

# A special cash payment for households which are exempt from the resident tax 住民税非課税世帯等に対する臨時特別給付金のご案内

<u>Each exempt household will be paid 100,000 yen.</u> There is a necessary procedure in order to receive the cash payment.


### OEligible households and procedures:

Eligible households must fall into one of the two following cases:

Note: If a household which pays the resident tax supports the members of another household, neither are eligible for the cash payment.

## Entire household is exempt from the resident tax

Households which are registered in Tsu City as of December 10th, 2021 and all the members are exempted from the resident tax.



 Please check the bank account numbers and information. Review the other check lists on the form and fill out the necessary parts and return it to Tsu City Hall. If you don't submit this form, you will not receive the cash payment.

# Sudden change in household budget

If a household's income has decreased due to COVID-19 since January 2021 and the sum of the income of a household for a year fell below the income threshold for exemption from the resident tax.

Applications are needed.

#### Xincome threshold for resident tax exemption (per a year)

Sample households	Net income	Gross income
Living alone / supporting no one financially	Under 415,000 yen	Under 965,000 yen
Supporting one person (i.e. spouse, etc.)	Under 919,000 yen	Under 1,469,000 yen
Supporting two people	Under 1,234,000 yen	Under 1,879,000 yen
Disabled people, widows, single parents, or minors	Under 1,350,000 yen	Under 2,043,000 yen
