

Guide to Childcare Allowance



* Be sure to apply within the month or within 15 days of the date on which your child was born.

Note that if you submit your application late, you may not be able to receive part of the allowance you would have received if you had applied on time.

[Overview of Childcare Allowance]

Eligibility

Childcare allowance is given to families who are raising a child below the third year of junior high school (a child who has not yet passed the first March 31 after reaching the age of 15).



Allowance amount

Children younger than age 3: 15,000 yen/month per child (uniform) Children ages 3 and older and not yet finished with primary school: 10,000 yen/month for the first and second child 15,000 yen/month for the third child and on

Junior high school children: 10,000 yen/month (uniform)



Payment period

On June 7, October 7 and February 7, as a rule (The amount up to the month prior to each month of payment will be paid on these dates.)

• Income limitation

^{*} Even if your income is higher than the income limitation amount shown above, you may still receive a monthly stipend of 5,000 yen per child.

[Commencement of payment]

You will receive your payment of childcare allowance beginning a month after you submit an application.

→ If your child was born or your family has moved to Tsu City at the end of the month and you cannot apply within the month, you can still receive your payment of allowance beginning the month following the month in which your child was born, even if the application has been carried over to the following month, by submitting an application within 15 days of the date your child was born or your scheduled move-in day.



<Recipients of childcare allowance are required to submit a notification on the following occasions>

- You will move out from Tsu City
- · You have a new child
- · You are no longer raising the child for whom you have been receiving child allowance
- You are no longer the primary income earner in your household due to marriage or other such reason
- You have become a government worker
- You will be living separately from your child (temporary posting away from home, divorce, admission into a facility, etc.)
- You or your child has deceased
